Andrew Rabinowitz

Co-president of R Baby Foundation, Andrew Rabinowitz is the chief operating officer and chief financial officer at Marathon Asset Management. Mr. Rabinowitz's responsibilities include global oversight of Marathon's operations, financial controls, systems, legal and compliance. He joined Marathon from Schulte Roth & Zabel, where he was a practicing lawyer in the corporate group specializing in hedge funds and asset management from 2000 to 2001.

Previously, Mr. Rabinowitz was employed at Ernst and Young for seven years as a certified public accountant (CPA) focused on hedge funds and asset management and broker-dealers. He supervised and conducted audits and oversaw consulting engagements in the financial services industry. Mr. Richards is responsible for general oversight of the firm and for global development of the various business lines.

Prior to founding Marathon, Mr. Richards worked on Wall Street during a 15-year tenure that included ten years as a managing director in charge of trading, investments and risk management in the fixed income division at Smith Barney and Donaldson, Lufkin & Jenrette. He began his career at Paine Webber. In 1982, Mr. Richards received his B.A. in Economics from Tulane University, graduating summa cum laude and a member of Phi Beta Kappa.

HONORARY BOARD

Jonathan Adler

Born in a farm town in New Jersey, Jonathan Adler discovered pottery at summer camp at age 12, and he spent his adolescence in his family's basement throwing pots. While studying semiotics and art history at Brown University, Mr. Adler continued making pots, creating a quilted line of pottery inspired by Chanel, despite advice to begin a career in law. He moved to New York in 1990 and began working at a talent agency, but he remained ambitious about becoming a potter.

In 1994, Mr. Adler showed his pots to Barney's and received his first order. Orders poured in, and in 1997 he joined Aid to Artisans, a non-profit organization that helps artisans in developing countries to make products for the American market. In 1998, he opened a store in Soho, and two additional locations – in East Hampton and Los Angeles – opened in 2000 and 2001. Launching a glamorous new furniture collection and beginning interior design projects, Mr. Adler developed a fascination with country club style and branched out into new categories – bedding, towels, stationery, and designing The Parker Palm Springs hotel. In 2005, he opened stores in Miami and Chicago, on Madison Avenue and in San Francisco. He also wrote his first design book.

Simon Doonan

Simon Doonan is a style commentator with over 30 years experience in the fashion world, and regularly guest-stars on Vh1, America's Next Top Model, Full Frontal Fashion and Sirius Satellite Radio. As Creative Director of Barneys New York, Mr. Doonan designs all aspects of Barneys' image. His sometimes-controversial window displays have been a Barneys trademark since 1985, and he writes the provocative "Simon Says" column in the New York Observer. Mr. Doonan's awards received include the National Association of Display Industries in 1988; Woolmark in 1993; Fashion Group in 1996; Benjamin Franklin Award in 1999; CFDA award in 1999; and the Markopoulos Award in 2003.

Mr. Doonan's career in fashion and the visual arts has aligned him with many key organizations, including the Metropolitan Museum of Art (hired by Diana Vreeland as display designer) and Christies (he designed the installation of the 1999 Marilyn Monroe Auction), along with countless other businesses and galleries. In addition to theater set design for the LA Theater Center and the Beverly Hills Playhouse, Mr. Doonan lent his talents to "Beverly Hills Cop" as set designer. After the 1998 publication of his memoir Confessions of a Window Dresser New Line Cinema quickly grabbed the film rights for Maverick Films to produce and Mr. Doonan to adapt. Simon & Schuster published his second book, Wacky Chicks; Life Lessons From Fearlessly Inappropriate and Fabulously Eccentric Women in April 2003, and it reached #9

on the LA Times best sellers list. His latest book entitled *Nasty: My family and other glamorous varmints* was published in June 2005.

Boomer Esiason

Boomer Esiason was selected from the University of Maryland by the Cincinnati Bengals in the 1984 NFL Draft. A veteran quarterback of 14 years with the Cincinnati Bengals, New York Jets and Arizona Cardinals, Mr. Esiason is the most prolific left-handed quarterback in NFL history. His career marks rank among the top ten in the NFL in all-time passing yards, career completions and career attempts, and he led the Bengals to Super Bowl XXIII against San Francisco.

Mr. Esiason has become a leading national figure in the fight against cystic fibrosis, where he has established the Boomer Esiason Foundation, raising millions of dollars to battle the disease. He and his wife, Cheryl, have been named honorary chairs of *Building Bridges to a Cure*, the national Cystic Fibrosis Foundation major gift campaign for its Therapeutics Development Program. Mr. Esiason has also worked with other community organizations: United Way, March of Dimes and Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) Foundation. He has authored several books and is a TV and radio regular.

John J. Mack

Mr. Mack was elected chairman of the board and chief executive officer of Morgan Stanley in June 2005. He previously spent nearly 30 years at the firm in various positions, most recently as president, chief operating officer and a director. Prior to his current role, Mr. Mack served as chairman of Pequot Capital Management. He served before that as co-chief executive officer of Credit Suisse Group and chief executive officer of Credit Suisse First Boston.

Mr. Mack is a graduate of Duke University, where he is a member of the board of trustees. He also serves as chairman of the board of trustees of New York-Presbyterian Hospital -- the university hospital of both Columbia and Cornell -- and as a trustee of the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation.

Dr. Bruce Brovender

Dr. Bruce Brovender is a native New Yorker. He grew up in the city, trained at New York University Medical Center and Lenox Hill Hospital, and attended for two years at Bellevue's emergency room. Dr. Bovender has been practicing as a general pediatrician for the past 19 years on Manhattan's Upper East Side.
